Early Childhood

Clanton Road, Charlotte, NC

Five star, high-quality child development center with an emphasis on family support and developmentally appropriate practices for children six weeks old to five years.

IMPACT

Early intervention services for children and caregivers that promote healthy social/emotional and behavioral development. IMPACT professionals work with early childhood centers to ensure children are successful.

Early Childhood Mental Health

Child Development Center

A team of therapists specializing in evidence-based practices for children ages 0-8 so challenges can be addressed proactively.





A Child's Place

Specialized case management to improve the lives of children and their families experiencing homelessness, focusing on three key priorities: access to resources, engage in healthy and supportive relationships, and increase self-sufficiency.

Child Welfare Case Management

Hillsborough County, FL

Family Stability

Intensive case management program with goals to stabilize, connect to services, and create permanency plans specific to the teens experiencing out-of-home care.

Family Education

An array of evidence-based and evidence-informed education classes for parents/caregivers with children of various ages, aimed at creating a strong foundation for successful parenting.

Family Partners

A team of caring peer support partners with lived experience who guide other parents through navigating the child welfare systems.

Foster Care Services

-Private foster homes located across the state of North Carolina providing basic, therapeutic, and respite care to youth

-Evidence-based training, 24/7 support

-TFC-O/Teen: A short-term (6-9 month) intensive, community-based treatment foster care program focused on serving high-risk teens with a 5-person support team which can prevent the need for residential group care.

In the Loop

Friends of the Children - Charlotte

Evidence-based life navigation program that provides a salaried, professional mentor to Charlotte's most at-risk youth for 12.5 years, no matter what. With our two-generation approach, we are leveraging our proven model to impact generational change for both youth and caregivers.



Family Centered Treatment

Home based treatment to stabilize youth & families who have experienced trauma, and those experiencing complex mental health symptoms. The goal being to eliminate out of home placements and higher levels of care.

Intensive In-Home

A high intensity, home-based service which works with youth and families multiples times per week in their home and community as well as providing 24/7 on-call support.

Outpatient Therapy Services Available in person and virtual

Individual, family, and group counseling, high quality clinical assessments, and psychiatric medication management. Available through private insurance & Medicaid.

Residential Treatment Services NC

An array of trauma-informed residential treatment programs for the most vulnerable and traumatized youth in our communities within safe, child-friendly living environments including;

Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF), a long-term 24/7 care for youth ages 6-17 diagnosed with a mental illness; Short-term Crisis Stabilization programs providing brief, intensive clinical care for youth ages 12-17.

School Based Therapy

Mental health services to school aged youth provided via outpatient therapy during the instructional day at select Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools.

High-Fidelity Wraparound

An evidence-based model that helps empower youth and families to find their voice and develop the skills necessary to successfully navigate various systems such as juvenile justice, child welfare and the school system. Wraparound approaches their work from the philosophy of "Do for, do with, cheer on!"
